ORDINANCE NO. 95-10

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH MIDDLETON, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING THE RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR NEWLY ELECTED SUPERVISORS.

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has enacted Act 60 of 1995, setting forth certain guidelines and limitations for the compensation of supervisors of townships of the second class, and

WHEREAS, said act provides that supervisors of townships having a population of 10,000 to 14,999 may be compensated in an amount not to exceed \$3,250 per year and

WHEREAS, the population of South Middleton Township is 10,340, and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly by said Act 60 authorizes the Board of Supervisors of the various townships of the second class to determine the compensation of supervisors subject to the limitations set for in the act,

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Each supervisor of South Middleton Township elected or appointed to office on or after the effective date of this ordinance shall receive compensation as supervisor in the annual amount of \$3,250.
2. Such compensation shall be paid in monthly or quarterly installments.
3. This ordinance shall be effective January 1, 1996.

ENACTED AND ORDAINED by said Board of Township Supervisors this 19th day of December, 1995, in lawful public session duly assembled.

SAMPLE ORDINANCE

SUPERVISOR COMPENSATION
(Per-meeting basis)

(Please note: The Pennsylvania Constitution prohibits an elected official from approving and receiving an increase in compensation during the current term of office. Any change in supervisor compensation will not apply to supervisors in office when this ordinance takes effect, and will only become effective upon election to another term.)

The following ordinance is hereby adopted by the Board of Supervisors of _____ Township, _____ County.

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has enacted Act ___ of 1995, setting forth certain guidelines and limitations for the compensation of supervisors of townships of the second class, and

WHEREAS, said act provides that supervisors of townships having a population of _____ to _____ may be compensated in an amount not to exceed \$ _____ per year, and

WHEREAS, the population of _____ Township is _____, and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly by said Act authorizes the board of supervisors of the various townships of the second class to determine the compensation of supervisors subject to the limitations set forth in the act,

Now, therefore it is hereby enacted and ordained as follows:

1. Each supervisor of _____ Township elected or appointed to office on or after the effective date of this ordinance shall receive compensation for attending duly advertised general or special public meetings or hearings of the board of supervisors, or other meetings authorized by the board of supervisors at the rate of \$ _____ for each meeting attended by such supervisor, not to exceed \$ _____ per year. (Note: The amount may not exceed the maximum allowed by law based on the population of the township.)

2. Such compensation shall be paid in monthly or quarterly installments.

3. This ordinance shall become effective on _____.

(NOTE: The township's intent to adopt an ordinance must be advertised by one of the following methods:

1) The entire text of the ordinance must be published at least once, not more than 60 days nor less than seven days before passage; or

2) The title and a brief summary of the ordinance must be published, along with the location at which the full text may be examined, not more than 60 days nor less seven days before passage. A copy of the full text of the ordinance must be filed with the publishing newspaper, and after the ordinance is enacted, a copy of the full text must be filed with the agency designated by the county

commissioners. The ordinance's effective date may not be less than five days after enactment.)
