ORDINANCE NO. 01-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS IN AND FOR SOUTH MIDDLETON TOWNSHIP, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4 OF 1989 ENACTED APRIL 20, 1989 AND THE "SOUTH MIDDLETON TOWNSHIP PRETREATMENT PROGRAM, JANUARY 1989" (AS SUBSEQUENTLY AMENDED BY ORDINANCES NO. 9 OF 1991 AND NO. 8 OF 1993) TO REVISE DISCHARGE LIMITATIONS

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Township Supervisors in and for the Township of South Middleton, as follows:

SECTION 1: PREAMBLE AND BACKGROUND.

On April 20, 1989 this Board of Township Supervisors enacted Ordinance No. 4 of 1989 which establishes a wastewater pretreatment program known as "South Middleton Township Pretreatment Program, January 1989". Said program was subsequently amended by Ordinance No. 9 of 1991 and Ordinance No. 8 of 1993. Because of changes permitted by the Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") in local wastewater discharge limitations, it was necessary to modify and amend the Pretreatment Program with respect to such limitations.

SECTION 2: AMENDMENT TO PRETREATMENT PROGRAM.

The Pretreatment Program is hereby amended in the following respect:

The Wastewater Discharge Limitations in subsection 8.2 of Section 8 on page 31 of the Pretreatment Program shall remain in full force and effect in all areas of South Middleton Township not discharging wastewater into the regional water pollution control facility operated by the Carlisle Borough Sewer System Authority.

New subsection 8.2A. of Section 8 on page 31 of the Pretreatment Program shall be as follows for users discharging wastewater into the regional water pollution control facility operated by the Carlisle Borough Sewer System Authority.:

8.2A. Wastewater Discharge Limitations

\*Users found discharging these Pollutants in excess of the above maximum limits shall, in addition to any other remedies provided under this Program, be assessed a surcharge for the removal thereof in accordance with the formula as provided in Section 4I hereinabove.

Individual significant industrial user permit limits will be developed in conjunction with flow limits for each significant industrial user. This will ensure that the allowable mass discharge for each user when combined with the other users' pollutant contributions will not exceed the local limits detailed above. Industrial discharge permit limits will be expressed as concentrations in specific significant industrial users wastewater discharge permits to simplify compliance monitoring.

SECTION 3: VALIDITY OF PRIOR ORDINANCES.

In all other respects, Ordinance No. 4 of 1989, Ordinance 9 of 1991 and Ordinance 8 of 1993 shall remain as heretofore enacted and amended.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY.

If any provision, section, sentence, clause or portion of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect any other provision, section, sentence, clause or portion of this ordinance which shall continue and remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: REPEAL OF PRIOR INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES.

All prior ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall become effective in accordance with existing law.
